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#### **CHAPTER 7**

## JUNIOR CANADIAN RANGERS APPEARANCE AND DRESS INSTRUCTIONS

#### **GENERAL**

1. The appearance of the Junior Canadian Rangers (JCR) shall, on all occasions, be such as to reflect credit on the Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) and the JCR Programme.

#### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 2. All those involved in the JCR Programme shall:
  - a. become acquainted with and obey all regulations and instructions for the performance of their duties; and
  - b. conform to the established policies of the JCR Programme.

#### **UNIFORM**

- 3. All JCR are issued clothing as outlined in the Scale of Issue D08120, JCR Equipment and Clothing.
- 4. Issued clothing will be worn, where practical, at all JCR activities. While there are no regulations for personal appearance, restrictions may be placed on those involved in the JCR Programme for reasons of safety or hygiene. Care shall be taken to keep issued clothing clean and in good repair. Issued and civilian clothing can be mixed in order to provide adequate protection as required
- 5. Issued clothing that has been lost or damaged may be replaced at no cost to the JCR.
- 6. National Cadet and Junior Canadian Rangers Support Group (Natl CJCR Sp Gp) is the approving authority for the wearing of badges and accourtements on the JCR uniforms.

#### **ORDERS OF DRESS**

- 7. The JCR uniform / orders of dress are a blend of authorized JCR Green items and civilian attire. JCR authorized items:
  - a. Ball-cap, green with embroidered JCR badge;
  - b. Sweatshirt, green hooded with JCR badge on front, rank tab centred above badge and Velcro removable Canadian flag on shoulder;
  - c. T-shirt, green JCR badge on the left chest and Canadian flag on left sleeve;
  - d. JCR black belt;
  - e. JCR shoes or civilian footwear relative to environmental conditions;
  - f. Authorized Cold Weather items;
  - g. Green fleece toque;
  - h. Green Canadian Cadet Organization (CCO) all-season coat with JCR badge;
  - i. Civilian pattern wind pants; and
  - j. CCO black gloves.

#### **RANK AND ACCOUTREMENTS**

- 8. JCR rank is worn primarily on the hoodie epaulette with JCR legend on the sweatshirt and green CCO coat.
- 9. Honours, decorations and medals are authorized for wear on the sweatshirt to be displayed on the right chest.
- 10. The poppy is authorized for wear on the sweatshirt to be displayed on the top centre of the rank tab. On the all-season coat, the poppy is to be displayed on the left chest as per image 7B-A.
- 11. Other accoutrements provided for in the approved JCR Programme Material Authorization D08120CFS may also be worn.




Figure 7B-A – Positioning of Poppy
